Course Title: Ethics
Course Credits: 3

Course Description: Examines human life, experience, and thought to discover and develop the principles and values for pursuing a more fulfilled existence. This course examines ethical theories designed to both justify moral judgments, as well as apply these ethical theories to a selection of personal and social issues in the world today. This is a statewide Guaranteed Transfer course in the GT-AH3 category.

1. Explain an Issue

a. Use information to describe a problem or issue and/or articulate a question related to the topic.

2. Utilize Context

- b. Identify assumptions.
- c. Analyze one's own and others' assumptions.

5. Understand Implications and Make Conclusions

- a. Establish a conclusion that is tied to the range of information presented.
- Reflect on implications and consequences of stated conclusion.

- 1. Explain major ethical concepts and describe the problems and/or issues in clarifying them that are used to comprehend and express moral or ethical problems.
- 2. Analyze major ethical theories.
- 3. Explain each major ethical theory from the perspective of a follower to identify what is significant in a particular situation or context for that theory.
- 4. Justify how each ethical theory reaches conclusions about what should be done regarding specific moral problems.
- 5. Reflect on the logical implications and consequences of the conclusions that each ethical theory reaches.
- 6. Demonstrate philosophical and/or logical thinking through writing and other forms of assessment.
